
4th TP = status drop immediately





Talon Point Privileges

GOLD

- Off campus in group of 3 and weekend activities (Thursday Sunday)
 - Students on Academic Probation: Friday Sunday
- Gym / Eagle Zone

SILVER

- Off campus in group of 3 (Sunday)
- Weekend activities (Friday Sunday)
- Gym / Eagle Zone

BRONZE

- Weekend activities (Sunday)
- Personal shopping (Sunday only from 8:30–9:30 a.m.)
- Gym / Eagle Zone (Friday Saturday)

Remain Positive

Use the word "expectations" instead of "rules."

Avoid using the words "strike" and "check."

Avoid using the word "no" and "can't."

Only mention the privileges that are noted on the guidelines; If something's not mentioned, then it is not permitted.

\$5 Eagle Zone Voucher


Students who reach GOLD status during the month:

Strategies

It doesn't work if you interfere (e.g., telling your student to be at the dorm on time)

No favoritism

Post the Talon Points expectations in several common areas

Showcase the raffle winners

Guidelines for giving a point

Give the point immediately following the unacceptable behavior.

Be clear. Point out the expectation not being followed.

Be consistent

It must be repeated consistently over a long period of time to have a lasting effect.

Guidelines for giving a point (continued)

Do not threaten or use your position to overpower the student.

It is not personal.

It will be a learning experience for the student.

It helps maintain a positive relationship between you and the student.


Previous Talon Points Program

- Weekly status
- Weekend privileges based
- Hard to track with points being given out to students abiding the expectations
- Students were becoming accustomed to the points and could play with the system.
- Expectations were subjective and not clear.

Current Talon Points Program

- Daily and immediate status
- Weekdays and weekend privileges based
- Expectations are objective and clear.
- Increased awareness of present status
- Students are doing more what are expected from them.
- Large increase in motivation and accountability.
- Less incident reports.
- More focus on building relationships with students.
