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



Understanding "Emerging and Disappearing Leaders":

- Peer to Peer interaction: Wolf Pack Mentality
- Emerging Leader example: New kid in town
- Disappearing Leader example: New kid in town again...(territorial)

Understanding "Emerging and Disappearing Leaders"...

From the Student Life staff end:

- Observation and guidance
- Contributes to shaping of events
- A "Coach"
- Variables in constant play that contribute to overall student success:
 - Student Life, Academia, Extracurricular Activities, Community Involvement, Parental Involvement, and so forth

Understanding "Emerging and Disappearing Leaders"...

- Every variable has its contributions:
 - Nature VS Nurture concept
- We are minorities of the minority
- Another example: Burnt-out leaders

Lived Experiences

- High School experiences at Rochester School for the Deaf
- First Mentor: Dr. Harold Mowl, Superintendent
- Gallaudet University

Frameworks of Leadership

- Leader-Member Exchange (LMX):
 - Experiencing leadership as a leader or a follower
 - Developing personal relationships rather than being a subordinate
 - One on one (peer to peer) creation and exchange of roles

Frameworks of Leadership

Transactional Leadership:

- Concept of exchange between the leader and their followers
- Applicability: Resources, Rewards, and Motivation FOR productivity, effectiveness, and results
- From who to who?

Frameworks of Leadership

Transformational Leadership:

- Leadership that inspires followers with Charisma, Inspiration, and Individual Consideration
- Treats every follower differently, but equitably
- Closely related to the LMX

Applicable Strategies for your Students

- First understand: <u>Anyone</u> and <u>Everyone</u> is a leader
 - Question needs to be: "When and how to have an effective leader"
 - Should not be based on success
- Second: Never assume
 - Apple's tardy staff example
- Third: emPOWERment
 - Power is essential but how can you empower your students?
